BUILDING UPDATE

There is some really exciting progress to share regarding the future of St Peter's! Nottinghamshire County Council has now submitted the planning application to Rushcliffe Borough Council for the demolition of our old school building. We have not yet been given a confirmed start date, but we are hopeful that the demolition will begin in the very near future.

This marks another important step forward as we continue to look towards the next chapter in the story of St Peter's. As soon as we have a confirmed date and further details, we will, of course, keep parents fully informed.

At the same time, plans for our new school building are beginning to take shape. Last week, we had our first preliminary design meeting with Arc and Nottinghamshire County Council, which was an exciting opportunity to start thinking about what our new school could look and feel like and, most importantly, how it can provide the very best environment for our pupils.

There is still a long way to go and we remain in the very early design stages, but it is fantastic to see the plans beginning to move from ideas towards reality. We will continue to share further information with you as the project develops.

We are incredible excited about what lies ahead!
