



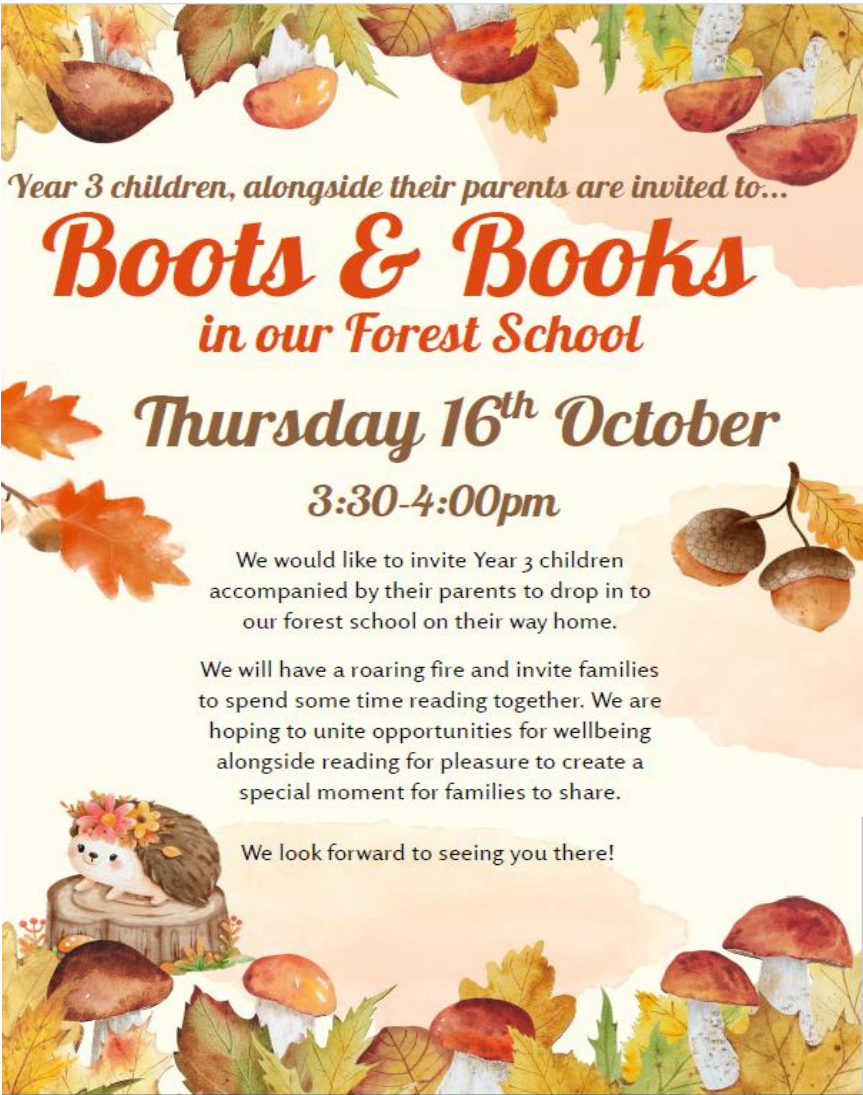

Over the past five years, Mrs Tartari has worked in various roles across St Peter's – from a Midday Supervisor, to Casper's and, to more recently, as a supply TA.

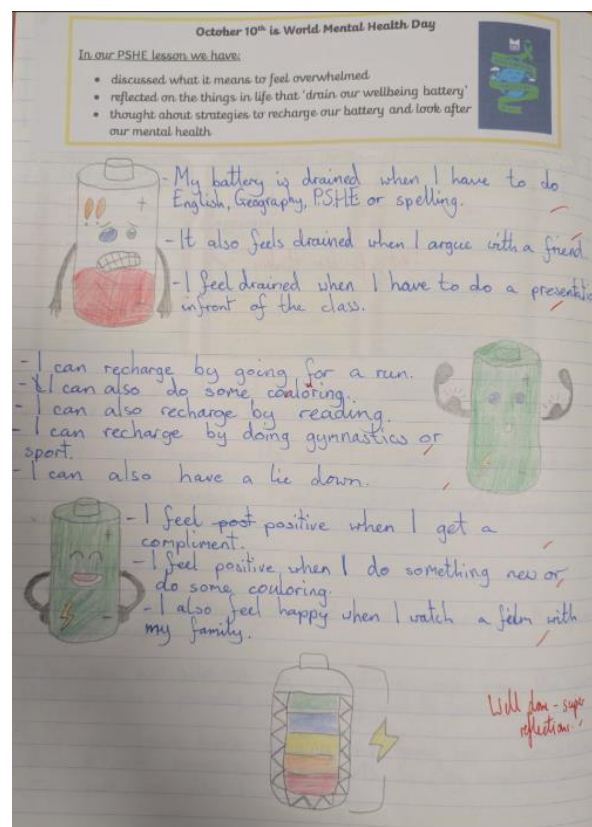
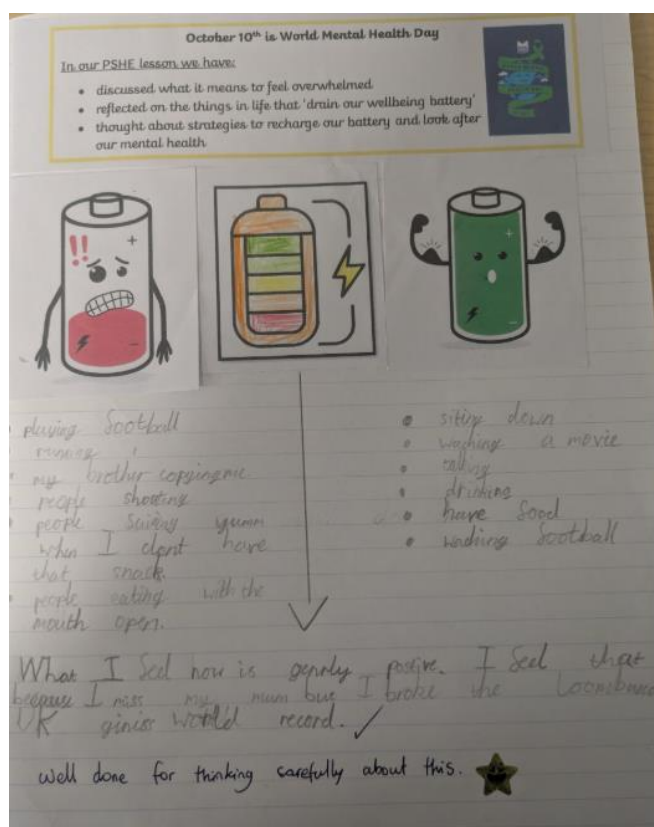
Mrs Tartari has been fantastic in every role she has done and her new school are very lucky to have her. Good luck in your new role!

After half-term, they will be put to work leading games/competitions and activities over lunchtimes for our younger pupils. The focus of Friday's training was 'inclusion' - that sport is for everyone and needs to be accessible and rewarding for all!

Chris Ballard was incredibly impressed with the children's collaborative approach to the session and with their understanding of 'being active for all'. The children learnt small group games, with adaptations when needed, promoting positive behaviour and high engagement.
