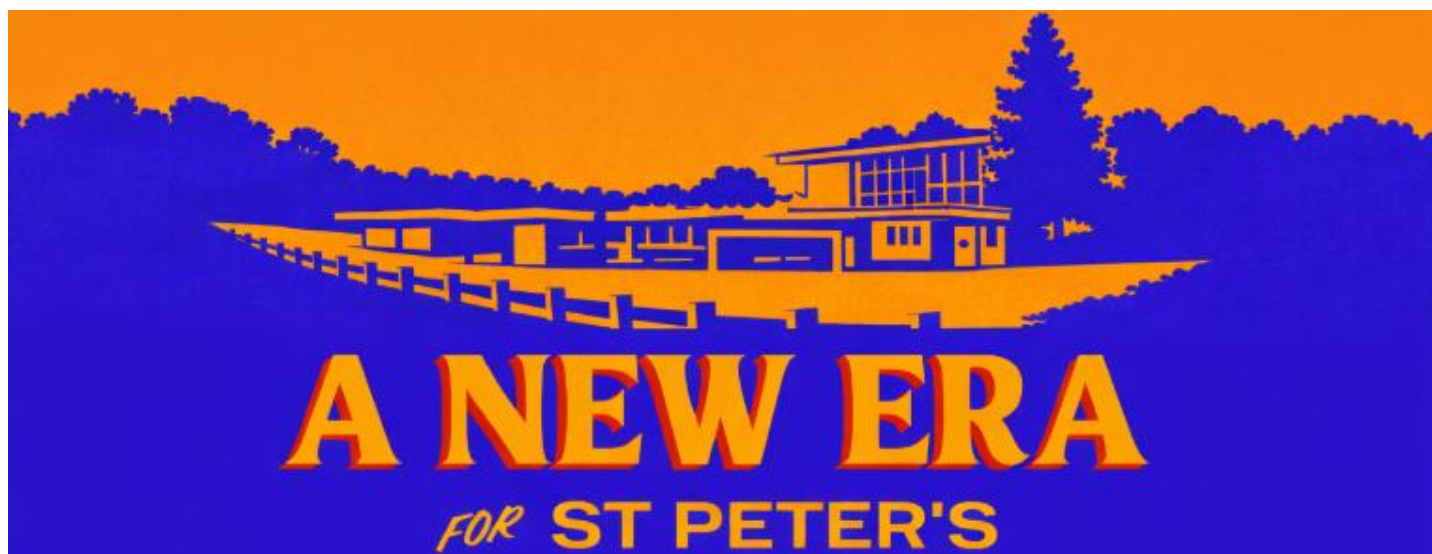

BE TICK AWARE

As the weather improves and we spend more time outdoors, the UK Health Security Agency (UKHSA) is reminding us to be aware of ticks and how to remove them safely and quickly, as some tick bites can cause infections such as Lyme disease.

Ticks live in many different outdoor environments, but they are particularly common in grassy and wooded areas such as our school grounds.

After spending time outside, it's very important to check yourself and your children for ticks.

If you find a tick on your child's body:

- remove the tick as soon as you can, using a tick removing device or fine-tipped tweezers
 - grab the tick as close to the skin as you can and pull upwards
 - clean the area with soap and water
 - keep an eye on the bite area for a few weeks in case of any changes
- if you see a spreading bullseye rash developing, or you become unwell with flu-like symptoms or a headache, contact your GP or NHS 111 immediately.



YEAR 6 PLAY TICKETS

Tickets for the Year 6 play are now available to purchase via Arbor and will remain available until Thursday 25th June 2026 at 11:59pm.

PLEASE NOTE...

- Tickets cost £2 each.
- Due to the smaller capacity of the new school hall, audiences will be limited to 100 people per performance.
- Each family will be permitted 4 tickets across ALL performances in total - NOT 4 tickets per performance. Different quantities of tickets may be purchased for different performances, so long as the total of all tickets purchased per family does not exceed 4.
- Ticket sales will be monitored and any orders found to exceed the 4 tickets allotted to each family will be cancelled and refunded. You will then have to re-book, subject to remaining ticket availability.
- No pay-on-the-door tickets. You must order in advance.
- Any tickets remaining after the 25th June will be put up for re-sale on a first-come-first-served basis. To express interest in these further tickets, please email: admin.office@stpetersjunior.org.uk.

How to Buy Your Tickets

1. Log into Arbor and select your Year 6 child's account.
2. Under 'Activities', select '[Child's Name]: Clubs'.
3. Select a performance date/time:
 - Year 6 Play 2026 - Wed 15th July at 9:30am
 - Year 6 Play 2026 - Wed 15th July at 6:00pm
 - Year 6 Play 2026 - Thurs 16th July at 2:00pm
 - Year 6 Play 2026 - Thurs 16th July at 6:00pm
4. On the next page, click 'Register [child's name] for this club'.
5. In the 'Choose Membership' drop down option, select the number of tickets that you wish to purchase for the specific performance. Click 'Next'.
6. In the 'Select Membership Periods' drop down option, select the date of the specific performance (there should only be one option). Click 'Next'.
7. Select 'Add to basket' or 'Make Payment' to enter your card details and complete the purchase of your tickets.

If you are unable to purchase tickets due to the maximum capacity on a given performance being exceeded, please try a different performance. If you are still unsuccessful, please email admin.office@stpetersjunior.org.uk.

NEW RSHE POLICY

From September 2026, all schools will be legally required to update their Relationships, Sex and Health Education (RSHE) curriculum and have an up-to-date written policy in place.

For primary pupils, the updated guidance places a stronger focus on online safety and wellbeing, the use of accurate terminology for body parts, and the introduction of personal safety around water, roads, and railways. There's also greater emphasis on helping children understand change and loss, including bereavement, and on developing communication skills, assertiveness, and the confidence to express personal needs and boundaries.
